Day 1

Day 2

Rafting on Neretva river

07:30h The day starts at Mostar

09:00h Arrival at city of Konjic

From 09:00 or 09:30h we continue towards the meeting point at Dzajici for 10:30h arrival

10.30h We continue towards the starting point, Zlatni Vir, and upon arrival at 11:30h we change clothing and enjoy a *late breakfast*

Presentation on rafting and safety issues


12:00h Rafting starts from "Zlatni vir" (the rafting session lasts approx. 4h)

Apx: 16:30h rafting ends and we continue towards the meeting point "Dzajici"

The rafting route is 21 km long - you will enjoy the untouched nature of Neretva Canyon

Return to Mostar (Free Time)

- After rafting or lunch, continue towards Sarajevo for an overnight stay and breakfast, included.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Passports and Visas

All nationalities require a full passport that must be valid for six months beyond the intended length of stay. It is your responsibility to have the correct personal documents and to obtain your own visa, if one is necessary, in accordance with the regulations of the country you are to visit. The information offered below is to help you with that process. We are not responsible for the actions of

local immigration and customs officials, whether at points of entry or otherwise, and any subsequent effects. At the time of writing visas are not required by American or EU passport holders. Other nationalities should check with the relevant embassies.
